Every month we have the privilege of serving here in New England, and we are blessed with many "fellowhelpers" who work alongside us in the ministry. Together, we endeavor to reach inmates, correctional officers, students, and teachers with the Gospel. Without these dedicated servants of God, much of what He allows us to accomplish would not be possible. I'm thankful for every one of these partners God has brought to us, giving them the chance to minister in ways they never knew they could. We have men and women who volunteer their time and resources, serving as graders, proofreaders, record keepers, preachers, and teachers. They also provide manual labor and so much more. I'm truly thankful for those who, as Paul said in Philippians 2:22, have "served with me in the gospel."

Family: Over the past two months, our family has enjoyed several memorable milestones. Matthew Jr. has begun teething and now proudly has two new teeth. His older brother, Timothy, has begun the arduous but rewarding task of potty training. We are certainly looking forward to the day he masters it! Over the summer, we encouraged Titus and Savannah to practice piano for 30 minutes each day. As a reward for completing his practice chart, I (Matthew) took Titus and a friend to a Manchester Fisher Cats game, our local minor league team. Savannah opted for having a pedicure for her reward. We had a great time and even saw a home run and a Fisher Cats victory! We started our school year a bit early, which gives us the flexibility to take time off for other activities as opportunities arise. The older children are using the Abeka video curriculum this year and are adjusting well. On a personal note, Hannah and I celebrated our 13th wedding anniversary on September 21. It seems like just yesterday we were walking down the aisle.

In those years, we've seen many changes: moving numerous times, becoming missionaries with Rock of Ages, traveling over 500,000 miles together, and welcoming four

children. Through it all, we can both truthfully say: "God's been good in my life, I feel blessed beyond my wildest dreams, When I go to sleep each night, And though I've had my share of hard times, I wouldn't change them if I could, Cause through it all, God's been good."

Ministry: In August, we traveled to Tennessee for the Rock of Ages National Conference. It was a great encouragement, not only to hear powerful preaching but also to learn that Rock of Ages Ministries has reached an amazing milestone. Since the ministry began keeping records in 1978, we have had the privilege of seeing over one million people come to know the Lord. We know this accomplishment is not due to our own efforts, but entirely by the grace of God, who calls and enables us to reach men and women for Christ! Alongside our regular ministry in prisons two to three times per week, August also included meetings in Tennessee, Vermont, Massachusetts, and New Hampshire. **September** was an exceptionally busy month. We began with a series of special meetings at all three New Hampshire state prisons, featuring guest speaker Bruce Frye. Over three nights, we held six different services and saw four people come to know the Lord. Three of these services were at a women's prison, where over 30% of the eligible population attended! Only God can do that. The following weekend, our home church participated in a Seedline project, and we were privileged to help assemble 20,000 Spanish-language copies of John & Romans that are now headed to Mexico City. September also marked the return of our school ministry, as we serve in three alternative schools each month. Please pray that God will open new doors for us to minister in other school systems here in New England. **Looking ahead, we are planning a prison revival at a local facility during the second weekend of November, Lord willing.** Please pray that God truly blesses this meeting, and that many souls will be saved and lives changed. We are so thankful for partners like you who make our ministry in New England possible. As we plan for the coming months, I am hoping to schedule in-person visits to share exciting updates and connect with new potential partners. It would be a privilege to share with your church what God is doing. Please let me know if there's a good time to connect. Your faithful prayers and generosity are essential, and we can't thank you enough.
